D.A.R.E. CHANGES WITH THE TIMES

Three Washington County deputies were among officers and deputies from across Minnesota, North Dakota and Wisconsin to make up the 54th graduating class of the Minnesota D.A.R.E. Officer school last month. Deputies Joseph Maloney, Cassandra Rice and Kevin Booth participated in the intensive two-week program at the Washington County Government Center in Stillwater.

D.A.R.E., which was founded in Los Angeles in 1983 and stands for Drug Abuse Resistance Education, is the largest and longest active community policing organization in Minnesota. The classroom-based program has evolved over the years from focusing mostly on substance abuse prevention to include more current issues such as cyberbullying awareness, mental health issues and suicide prevention, all aimed at giving law enforcement participants even more tools for guiding and impacting students of all ages.

“It won’t be easy, but remember you are making a difference. They will look to you for guidance, and they’ll depend on you for answers, and they will always remember you,” said Sheriff Dan Starry at the graduation ceremony. “You represent the best in law enforcement.”

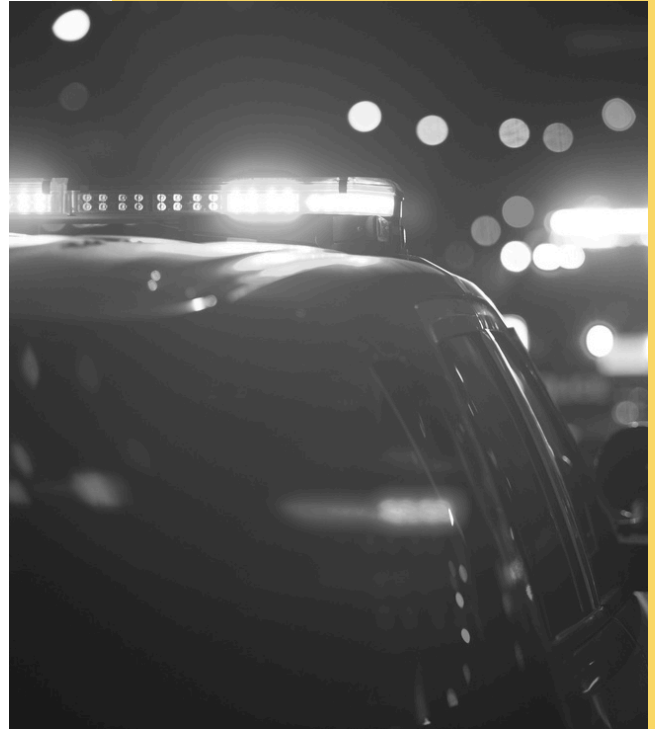
